636/17 Confirmation of minutes

RESOLVED – that the minutes of the meeting held on the Thursday 21st January 2017 were agreed and signed as a true and correct record.

637/17 Matters Arising

- a) Old School House Further to minute 624/17(a) No new information to add
- b) **Tydd Waterway Route** Further to minute 624/17(b) Cllr Clark reported that since the walkway has been open there has been an issue arisen. Coming down from the Head of the Drainage Board all dogs must be kept on a lead. Apparently when one man was approached on the matter his reply was a tirade of verbal abuse. In order for this not to re-occur people need to be made aware. Cllr Clark said that she would try to get something put into the next parish magazine to make people more aware of this.
- c) Church Grounds Further to minute 624/17 © Cllr Jupp has dealt with matters. Bushes have been trimmed back through the public right of way. The big patch of brambles have not been removed yet. A tree surgeon has been out to inspect the tree but have not received his report yet, but he did not seem to concerned about the tree.
- d) **Village Sign** Further to minutes 624/17(d) Still in hand. Cllr Ware reported that the W.I is 90 years old next year so it would be nice to do something then. Cllr Hale-Smith arrived.

638/17 Police Matters -

February has been a relatively quiet month in the north rural area's of Wisbech as far as crime is concerned. We have though, been very busy following the aftermath of Storm Doris, where we have attended various locations mainly to attend to fallen trees. If there are any trees that you are concerned about, please contact the Highways Department at your local County Council.

There have been several hare coursing incidents in the rural locations of Wisbech, where hare coursers have been spotted at numerous locations. We continue to pursue this matter, and we would encourage anyone who has any information regarding hare coursing to report it to the police as soon as possible.

We continue to attend schools in the rural villages at the beginning and end of school times, to engage with the children, parents and teachers. I am pleased to report that during February, there were no issues or concerns.

We would like to thank everyone involved for the use of the foyer at Gorefield Community Centre where we held our Community Contact Point on 21st February 2017, and for the hospitality we received from the art group. Fenland District Council – Cllr Clark reported – Golden Age Meeting – with the permission of the parish council, she wishes to hold a Golden Age Fayre in June, either 7th or 8th (check to see when hall is available.). Would the PC be willing to pay for the hire of the hall. RESOLVED – all councillors agreed to pay for the hire of the hall.

Cllr Hale-Smith reported that Cllr Seaton and Alex Warner (Highways Dept) have reported back that there will be only 1 passing place as there is not enough traffic on the road to warrant two passing places. Also it is on the plans of the development for 1.8m from development boundary wall. Cllr Seaton said that it will not require any use of the Highway. During the build the development is responsible for the state of the pathways. Cllr Hale-Smith said that the wall is in the wrong place but has been there a long time, the path would narrow past the wall. Cllr Clark said that she would forward an e-mail from Cllr Seaton to Cllr Hale-Smith.

- a) **Highway Matters** Cllr Minney and Cllr Hale-Smith have inspected and both got nothing to report. Bedford Rd is flooding badly, Cllr Hale-smith has followed this up. Cllr Hale-Smith reported that as a priority requirement the Parish Council need to write to J Henry as they have left property in a state and that they need to review their work urgently. All council agreed.
- b) Church Grounds No concerns at the moment, just waiting for the report from FDC about tree.
- c) New Street Names Previously circulated to Councillors The Parish Council Has been asked to decide between the names Sapphire Close or Lilibet Close for the new road in Tydd St Giles. After a discussion its was RESOLVED to go with Sapphire Close. Cllr King Arrived
- d) Street Lights Cllr King reported that FDC are continuing to have problems with Balfour Beattie and have been let down by them. They are now looking into entering into different contracts with other sources. As they feel they have been undermined they don't know whether Balfour Beattie will live up to their promises in the future. A lack of consistency is still ongoing.
